Huntington Beach, California, USA, November 1, 2019 - Team USA moved into pole position after six days of competition at the 2019 VISSLA ISA World Junior Surfing Championship presented by Visit Huntington Beach.

USA stands as the only nation with ten of twelve surfers still remaining in the event, holding a slight lead over a tightly packed field of nations looking to surpass them over the final two days of competition in Huntington Beach.

Sitting behind USA, still within striking distance of the Gold Medal are Japan, Hawaii, and Spain. The 2018 Gold Medalist Team Japan is primed to make a run at the Gold, with their two past individual Gold Medalists, **Joh Azuchi** and **Keanu Kamiyama**, advancing strong in the Boys U-18 Repechage Rounds.
